

I will look to the Hills

Psalm 121 KJV

21 I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help. **2** My help cometh from the Lord, which made heaven and earth. **3** He will not suffer thy foot to be moved: he that keepeth thee will not slumber. **4** Behold, he that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep. **5** The Lord is thy keeper: the Lord is thy shade upon thy right hand. **6** The sun shall not smite thee by day, nor the moon by night. **7** The Lord shall preserve thee from all evil: he shall preserve thy soul. **8** The Lord shall preserve thy going out and thy coming in from this time forth, and even for evermore.

Giving Honor to God the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the Holy Spirit.
To All of God's Sons, Daughters, and Children. Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow. Let's turn to Psalm 121, as we lift up the Name of the Lord.
Our topic today is "I will Look to the Hills."

I lift up my eyes to the hills— from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber. In many ways we can attest that life is a journey. My brothers and sisters, there is one that provides help and assurance throughout our days. During the journey, especially in the mountainous region of the Judean Hills, the psalmist realizes that the Lord is the only One who can give you the help that you need.

Have you ever stopped to reflect on the complexity of God? I mean have you ever really thought about who God is? The reality is that God is so complex that it's too hard for us to even understand. But in His love and infinite wisdom, God will break down His own complexity to simplify things for humanity. What are you talking about preacher? Thank you. I'm so glad that you asked. He's Omnipotent and Omnipresent, but If you are hungry, He will be your bread. If you're homeless, He'll be your shelter. If you're lonely, He'll be a friend that sticketh closer than a brother. If you're lost; He'll be your Amazing Grace. If you're depressed or oppressed, He'll be

your shield and buckler. If you don't have a foundation, He'll be your rock in a weary land. So, the psalmist says, "I will lift up my eyes to the hills – because "Hallelujah" that is where my help comes from. My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. God's going to make sure that your foundation is firm. God is attentive to your situation, which means that He is on the job. He doesn't have to sleep so He is working on your situation. He is working on my life. He's working on your life.

The one who trusts in the Lord is certain that He will bring them protection day and night. Psalm 121:4-7 says *"Behold, He that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep. The Lord is thy keeper: the Lord is thy shade upon thy right hand. The sun shall not smite thee by day, nor the moon by night. My brothers and sisters ,isn't it a blessing to know that the Lord has been keeping you?"* While we sleep; the Lord is keeping us. While we go through dangers seen and unseen; the Lord is keeping us. While we drive down the highways and byways; the Lord is keeping us. While at school, the Lord is keeping us. While at work, the Lord is keeping us. While at leisure, the Lord is keeping us. I'm convinced that our minds are intact, simply because the Lord has kept us in the morning, noonday, and in the midnight hour. Thank You Lord. Can anybody testify that if it had not been for the Lord on our side, where would we be? Psalm 121 verse 7 says "The Lord shall preserve thee from all evil: He shall preserve thy soul. I'm so thankful that the lord made a way for us. *The reality is that all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins. It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith.* (Romans 3:23-27)

In closing, Psalm 121 verse 8 teaches us that "The Lord shall preserve thy going out and thy coming in from this time forth, and even for evermore." Somebody should shout with me this morning. This means that the Lord is always and will always be with us. Romans 8:28-31 says "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are

the called according to his purpose. For whom He did foreknow, He also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. Moreover, whom He did predestinate, them He also called: and whom He called, them He also justified: and whom He justified, them He also glorified. What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us?

He's an on-time God. Yes, He is. Job said "He may not come when you want him, but He'll be there right on time." You can ask the 5,000 hungry souls He fed, on the banks of the river, with two fish and 5 loaves of bread. What a miracle, He performed for the multitude. What He did, way back then. He'll do today, for me and you. No matter what it may look, sound, or feel like this morning, decide right now that you will look to the hills – from whence your help comes from. Your help, my help, our help comes from the Lord. I will, you will, we will, look to the Hills, because He is an On-Time God. Hallelujah to the Lamb of God. Amen.
