

# I Know My Redeemer Lives

**Job 19:25 - "For I know that my Redeemer *and* Vindicator lives,  
And at the last He will take His stand upon the earth. (AMP)**

Giving Honor to God the Father, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. To All of God's Sons, Daughters, and Children. Today we lift up Job, Chapter 19, verse 25, as we lift up the Name of the Lord. Our topic is "I Know My Redeemer Lives."

All have sinned and come short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23) Because of Sin, something must die. Romans 6:23, teaches us that the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. Jesus is our redemption. O' Yes, He Is... Hallelujah.

John the Baptist recognized Jesus as the ransom that would be required to pay the outstanding unsurmountable debt on the lives of humanity. He called Him the Lamb of God, that comes to take away the sins of the world. (John 1:29)

Historically, Yom Kippur is known as the Day of Atonement. The focus is on repentance and is designed to highlight one's need for forgiveness and reconciliation with God. This is the holiest day of the year and is a day of fasting to express repentance and the need for forgiveness. On this day, the priests forego their usual ornate attire and wear all white as a sign of personal purity. It is a day to turn away from anything humanly mundane and focus on their relationship with God. The community prayed that God would accept their animal sacrifices as atonement for their sins and write their names in the Book of Life for the upcoming year.

Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) was an annual event. Every year they repeated the same confessions, the same rituals and the same sacrifices, only different details and different animals. Why? Because "*It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins.*" (Hebrews 10:4) Created things tainted by sin, can never settle sin's debt. Yom Kippur was not designed to be the solution to humanity's sin, but rather

to point to the One who was promised to be the answer.

“But when Christ appeared as a high priest of the good things to come, He entered through the greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is to say, not of this creation; and not through the blood of bulls and goats, nor the ashes of a heifer sprinkling those who have been defiled and sanctified for the cleansing of the flesh. How much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God? (*Hebrews 9:11-14*)

Pause for a moment. Wherever you are right now. You may have some circumstances and some situations that you’re dealing with. Can I get a witness? Where are you in life and where is life in you? Even now, at this very moment, you can turn it over to the Lord Jesus. He’s a healer. He’s a deliverer. He’s a mighty good friend. He’s waiting on you! My brothers and sisters, you can talk to Him and sing *‘What can wash away my sin? Nothing but the Blood of Jesus. What can make me whole again? Nothing but the Blood of Jesus. O’ precious is the flow, that makes me white as snow; No other fount I know; Nothing but the Blood of Jesus.’*

The Apostle Paul shared the importance of being specific in our requests of the Lord, and in our prayers, intercessory prayers/thanksgiving for others and on the behalf of all people. We should pray for leaders and those in high authority, so we can live a peaceful quiet life of godliness and dignity. God honors these prayers, which are pleasing in His sight. It is God’s desire for all to be saved and to come to the knowledge and understanding of the truth. The truth is that there is only one God, and only One Mediator between God and mankind, the Man Christ Jesus, who gave Himself as a ransom for all. (1 Tim. 2:1-6)

What I’m telling you is that Jesus paid it all. You’ve been bought with a price. Good God Almighty. You’re free. And Whom the Son set free, is free indeed. Somebody ought to say Hallelujah! The ransom was Jesus Christ. He was the sacrifice and the total atonement of our sin. He is the Lamb of God. Jesus is the one who redeemed us from death, hell, and destruction. Christ’s death

on Calvary's Cross was the payment that redeemed us from the debt of sin that we owed, guaranteeing us eternal life through Christ Jesus. They hung Him high and stretched Him wide. He hung on the Cross for us. He died-He died. O' He died. But I found out that on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day morning... that He got up. Yeah, Yeah, Yeah. He got up with all power in His hand. He didn't stay in the grave but He got up and He lives. He Lives. HE LIVES!!!

In closing, for I know my redeemer lives... Jesus is our salvation. Because He rose, now you can rise. You can come out of the darkness into the marvelous light. Come on out of the storm and ask Jesus Christ to come into your heart. *Romans 10:9-11 says that if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed.* Let me ask you... Who taught the sun where to stand in the morning? And who told the ocean, you can only come this far? And who showed the moon where to hide 'til evening? Whose words alone can catch a falling star? Well, I know my Redeemer lives. I know my Redeemer lives. All of creation testifies. This life within me cries. *I know my Redeemer lives.* I spoke with Him this morning. *Hallelujah, Amen.*
