

Every Praise is to Our God

Psalm 150-Praise ye the Lord. Praise God in his sanctuary: praise him in the firmament of his power. ² Praise him for his mighty acts: praise him according to his excellent greatness. ³ Praise him with the sound of the trumpet: praise him with the psaltery and harp. ⁴ Praise him with the timbrel and dance: praise him with stringed instruments and organs. ⁵ Praise him upon the loud cymbals: praise him upon the high-sounding cymbals. ⁶ Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord. Praise ye the Lord.

Giving Honor to God the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the Holy Spirit. To All of Gods Sons, Daughters, and Children. Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow. Let's turn to Psalm 150, as we lift up the Name of the Lord. The topic of today's didactic sermon is "Every Praise is to Our God."

How do you start your day? Have you considered the empowering opportunity of giving our God some praise. The 150th Psalm is so powerful because it starts with praise... and the praise goes to God. In fact, it provides instruction for us to Praise the Lord. This is sound instruction on how we should begin our day, as well. Our day should begin with praise. Our God is Holy and He inhabits the praises of His people. (Psalm 22:23) The term inhabit means "to dwell in". Yes, God dwells in the praises of His people. You can find God right there in your praise. Praising God's Holy name ushers God's presence into the midst of your situation. O' Yes. The Lord comes into the room and transforms situations and circumstances. Every Praise is to our God!

My brothers and sisters, if the Lord woke you up... Give God some Praise. If you can talk... Give God some Praise. If you can move... Give God some Praise. If you can walk ... Give God some Praise. If you can move ... Give God some Praise. If you made it through another day's journey... Give God some Praise. If the Lord kept you in your in your right mind... Give God some Praise. If He rescued you in the midnight hour, you ought to lift up your voice... and Give God some Praise. Secondly, the 150th Psalm shares some logistical truths to aid worshippers to better understand why we should praise our God. You can praise God at your house. You can praise God at the Mall. You can praise the Lord in your prayer closet, you can praise Him in the sanctuary, or in the parking lot, but wherever you are...

you ought to give God some praise because every praise is to our God!

We praise the Lord for His mighty acts. Remember how God has showed up at various times in your life and performed the supernatural. Hasn't the Lord brought us all from a mighty long way? O' Yes. You have witnessed God's wonder working power time and time again. The fact that you're still here is testimony of God's Goodness. O How Excellent is thy Name Lord... In all the earth! The Psalmist helps us to understand the blessing of musical praise and worship of our God. Yes, we praise God with the sound of the trumpet and other musical instruments (piano, keyboard, guitar, drums, cymbals, tambourine, etc). We praise our God in our shout and in our dance because He is so worthy of the praises of His people. Can anybody testify that every Praise is to our God!

In closing, we all owe God a Praise, and the Word of God teaches us "Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord." (Psalm 150:6) If you find that you are lost and out of the ark of safety, it's time to come in. All have sinned and come short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23) The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. (Romans 6:23)

I'm coming on in now, and if you would allow me to share in this vernacular... I'd like to conclude this didactic sermon with a 3:16 study (chapter & verse). Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you? (**1 Corinthians 3:16**) Hereby perceive we the love of God, because He laid down His life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. (**1 John 3:16**) For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. (**John 3:16**) Praise be to God, let everything that hath breath praise the Lord, because every praise is to our God. Hallelujah, Amen.
