

## *He'll do it Again*

**Micah 7:18-19 (KJV) - Who is a God like unto thee, that pardoneth iniquity, and passeth by the transgression of the remnant of his heritage? he retaineth not his anger for ever, because he delighteth in mercy. He will turn again, he will have compassion upon us; he will subdue our iniquities; and thou wilt cast all their sins into the depths of the sea.**

Giving Honor to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. To All of God's sons, daughters, and children. Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow. As we take a look at the text, Micah 7:18-19, I'd like to tag this sermon with the topic "He'll do it Again."

Have you ever experienced a tough situation? Or a really trying week, a rough month, or even a dismal year? Well, if you just reflect for a moment, you may be able to witness that "Yes" I've been through some storms, but there is a witness in my spirit today - that the very profound fact, that we are still here is evidence that God fixed the issues, situations, and circumstances. Can I get a witness? The reality is that He didn't just fix it one time, but God has continued to bless us time and time again. My brothers and sisters, I just wanted to encourage you today to understand that "He'll do it again." He's and On Time God, not a One Time God.

The biblical text (Micah 7:18) helps us to understand that there is no other like God. Hallelujah!!! God forgives us of our sins. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and cleanse us from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9). He can't stay angry with His people because He is a God of love and mercy. That's who He is. Hallelujah!!! Furthermore, God will have compassion on us. He treads our sins beneath His feet and casts our sins into the depths of the ocean. **Yes, God casts our sins into the sea of forgetfulness.** (Micah 7:18) You may feel that your sins and past mistakes are so big that you don't deserve God's forgiveness. Welcome to the crowd. None of us deserve it, but by His Saving Grace, God has made it available to us. Perhaps you've done things that make you feel unworthy, less-than, ashamed, and downtrodden. Sin will burden you down, making you feel inadequate and isolated. Past regrets can

serve as a barrier to you getting your breakthrough and your blessings.

I'm so glad that the Lord is still working on us, our situations, and our circumstances. The Lord Jesus is the same today, yesterday, and forever. (Hebrews 13:8) Think for a moment about your past week. He worked it out last week, He fixed it last year, and He's working on the new issue right now. Not only did the Lord solve it back then but He will do it again. *Just ask Daniel in the Lion's Den. Won't the Lord do it again? Just ask Moses by the Red Sea. Won't the Lord do it again? Just ask the woman at the well. Won't the Lord do it again? Just ask Shadrack, Meshack, and Abed-Nego. Won't the Lord do it again?* The answer is Yes, Yes, Yes, Yes, Yes, Yes. *Now, I'm asking you today.* Whether you're in the valley or at your own personal Red Sea... Won't the Lord do it again? Oh Yes!!! I know He will..

In closing, God will do it Again. He will bless you again. Come to the Lord with a repentant heart and He will forgive you of all your sins. He sent his son Jesus Christ that we might have salvation in the Lord. ***For God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son so that anyone who believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16) May the Lord Bless You in the Newness of Life, in Jesus Name.*** Blessings are on the way. You may not know how. You may not know when, but He'll do it again. You may feel down and feel like God has somehow forgotten that you are faced with circumstances that you can't get through. (He'll wipe the tears from your eyes.) But right now, it seems that there's no way out, and you're going under. God's proven time and time again He'll take care of you. He'll do it again (Oh He'll do it again). He'll do it again (Yes, He will do it again). If you'll just take a look at where you are now and where you've been. Hasn't He always come through for you? He's the same now as He was then (Don't you know God has not changed). You may not know how. You may not know when, but He'll Do It Again!!! Hallelujah, Amen.
